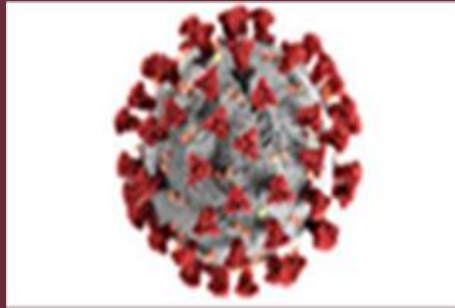

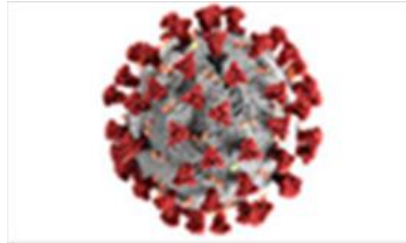

Lloyda Broomes Williamson, M.D., D.F.A.P.A., F.A.A.C.A.P., is Professor and Chair of the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Meharry Medical College. She obtained a B.S. in Natural Sciences from Oakwood College, (now known as Oakwood University), in Huntsville, AL, before going on to obtain her Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree from Meharry Medical College. Dr. Williamson completed a Psychiatry Residency and a Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Fellowship at Emory University and is board certified in both specialties. She is a Distinguished Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association and the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry.



Monty Burks, CPRS, PhD, serves as the Director of Faith-Based Initiatives for the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services. In this role, he is responsible for engaging and connecting Tennessee's faith communities to the behavioral health care system, with the goal of expanding addiction and mental health support services across the state. Dr. Burks also oversees the Tennessee Lifeline Peer Project, a state program aimed at reducing the stigma associated with people who suffer from addiction and the Tennessee Faith-Based Community Coordinators, whom seek to help congregations build their capacity to combat addiction and mental health issues in their respective community.
